# 2. The Historical Archives of the EU and the written memories of the European integration (HAEU Archives Reading Room)

Introducing the HAEU and its holdings, presentation of a set of original documents from numerous EU institutional and private archival holdings.

#### 3. 70 years after the Schuman Declaration (Cloister)

Presentation, selected display, concept and implementation of the 2020 exhibition project of the Historical Archives of the EU about the Schuman Declaration
